FSCNY PRESENTED 20th ANNUAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

May 10th, 2016, Brooklyn, NY - The Financial Service Centers of New York (FSCNY) presented its **20th Annual Scholarship Awards** to seven students from the New York City Metropolitan Area and Westchester County.

The students received over \$40,000 in scholarship money and prizes, the highest annual amount ever granted by the **FSCNY/MoneyGram Scholarship Program**. FSCNY's Scholarship Program has granted more than three-quarter of a million dollars to 317 students, since its inception in 1996.
