# FSCNY ANNOUNCES WINNERS OF \$40,000 IN ACADEMIC AWARDS FOR 2014 COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Suffolk County Student Wins Top \$7,500 Prize for Leadership and Academic Excellence

Scholarships provided to 16 academic leaders from all five boroughs and Long Island

NEW YORK, NY – Sixteen academic leaders from all five boroughs and Long Island received \$40,000 in educational scholarships, Financial Service Centers of New York (FSCNY) announced today at its 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference and Exposition. Kevin Reis Chavez of Kings Park High School in Suffolk County was awarded the program's grand \$7,500 prize. Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz Jr. delivered the keynote address at the FSCNY/MoneyGram International Scholarship Luncheon honoring this year's winners.

Each of the selected students will receive between \$500 to \$7,500 in a cash grant to be applied towards their freshman year of studies at a college or university of their choice. Each year since its inception in 1996, the FSCNY/MoneyGram International Scholarship Program has recognized New York high school students for their academic achievements and community service. The scholarship has awarded approximately \$677,500 in academic awards to 300 New York State students since the program's inception. A full list of this year's award winners is provided below.

Additionally, Richard Kelsky, President of FSCNY member TellerMetrix, generously donated a laptop to the grand prize and first place winners. The scholarship program is generously supported between a wide range of FSCNY members and MoneyGram International.

The student leaders were selected to receive FSCNY's scholarships based on their academic achievements, commitment to community service, leadership skills and perseverance in the face of significant obstacles. The Financial Service Centers launched the scholarship program in 1996 as a means of investing in New York State's future.
